Orlando, Florida, may be known as the theme park capital of the world, but this vibrant city offers so much more than rollercoasters and fireworks (although those are pretty magical too!). From thrilling adventures to serene nature escapes, fantastic dining, and year-round sunshine, Orlando is a destination that captivates travellers of all ages.

Whether you're visiting for the first time or returning to relive the magic, Orlando delivers unforgettable experiences, warm hospitality, and endless reasons to stay a little longer.

VISTA / Getting there

Several major airlines offer regular direct flights from the UK to Orlando International Airport, with flight durations of approximately 9 to 10 hours. British Airways, Virgin Atlantic, and TUI all operate non-stop services from London, Manchester, and other regional airports.

Booking 6-9 months in advance is a good idea for the best fares, particularly during peak family travel periods like Easter, summer holidays, and Christmas.

Booking Tips

Book 9-11 months in advance for the best rates, especially for peak seasons (January-March).

Avoid peak periods like Christmas, Easter, and the school summer holidays, when prices can surge.



Best Time to Fly

Mid-January to early March and late September to mid-November are generally the most budget-friendly times to fly.

VISTA / A seasonal guide

Orlando is a year-round destination with something magical in every season — from flower-filled springs and summer water park days to autumn celebrations and festive winter fun. Here's a feel for what each season brings...





SPRING

(March - May)

One of the loveliest times to visit. The weather's warm and sunny without being too hot, the parks are in full swing, and gardens across the city burst into bloom — especially at EPCOT's International Flower & Garden Festival. It's ideal for families, first-timers and anyone wanting to experience the parks at a comfortable pace.



AUTUMN

(September - November)

A fantastic time to visit if you prefer fewer crowds and shorter queues. The weather's still warm, and the city leans into seasonal fun with Halloween events, themed park nights, and food festivals. It's a great balance of value, fun and a slightly slower pace.



SUMMER

(June - August)

Hot and humid with afternoon showers – perfect for water parks and indoor attractions. Families love the summer buzz.



WINTER

(December - February)

Mild and sunny - a great time for festive celebrations, golf, and park hopping without the heat.

VISTA | Where to Stay

Orlando offers an incredible variety of accommodation options, from playful family-friendly resorts to sleek downtown hotels and peaceful villa communities. Whether you're all about theme park proximity or seeking a more laid-back, local feel, there's a perfect base for every kind of holiday.

Lake Buena Vista & Disney Resort Area

This popular area surrounds Walt Disney World and is packed with hotels that offer easy access to the parks – including many with shuttles. It's a convenient base for families wanting to maximise their time in the parks while also being close to Disney Springs, which offers dining, shopping, and entertainment options.

International Drive (I-Drive)

A lively strip packed with restaurants, attractions, and hotels, I-Drive is a top pick for first-timers or those without a car. It's home to ICON Park and offers easy connections to Universal Orlando and SeaWorld via shuttles or the I-Ride Trolley. You'll find everything from budget inns to big-brand resorts with pools and on-site dining.

Universal Orlando Resort Hotels

Universal's collection of eight themed hotels includes options for every budget. Guests benefit from early park entry and, at select hotels, free Universal Express Passes. 
Celebration

Winter Garden

Located west of Orlando, Winter

scenic bike trails, and easy day trips to the
theme parks.



Watch gators leap at the Jumparoo Show, brave the Screamin' Gator Zip Line, or explore the Stompin' Gator Off-Road Adventure. Educational, exciting, and family-friendly, it's a relaxed alternative to the big parks and a great half-day trip for anyone wanting to experience Florida's wilder side.

With over 50 rides and attractions for ages 2 to 12, zones include LEGO NINJAGO, LEGO City, and pirate adventures. Highlights include Disney's Typhoon Lagoon and Blizzard Beach, plus Universal's Volcano Bay with high-tech fun. With options for all ages, they're a must for families seeking a splash of adventure and relaxation in the Florida sun.

Top Water Parks

Volcano Bay (Universal Orlando Resort): A high-tech water park with a towering volcano, thrilling slides, and TapuTapu tech for virtual queuing.

Explore trails and wetlands at Tibet-Butler Nature Preserve and Shingle Creek Regional Park. Swim, canoe, or hike at Wekiwa Springs State Park, just 30 minutes away. Nature lovers can also explore Ocala National Forest or drive the scenic Lake Apopka Wildlife Drive for birdwatching. These escapes reveal a quieter, wilder Florida — perfect for families, hikers, and photographers alike.

Lake Eola Park: An urban escape with swan boats, markets, walking paths, and skyline views in downtown Orlando.

Make your Dining Reservations Early



Entry Requirements
